- (3) Consider the prayer, "Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven." What does this mean?
- (4) What do we see in these verses about the relationship of the kingdom to doing God's will?

- (5) What were the three wills of God that we considered when looking at the third petition?

- (a) What does each mean?
- (b) Which category of God's will does each of these texts fit into?

- (c) Why is it important that we make this distinction?
- (6) What are common ways that Christians think about and act on "the will of God?" Evaluate each approach for whether it reflects the way we see God's will handled in Scripture.
- (7) What is YOUR relationship to the will of God? How did this sermon clarify the subject for you?
- (8) What tangible ways should the will of God shape our prayers?
 - (a) What would that look like?
 - (b) What were the four commitments that arose in the sermon from recognizing that God's revealed will is NOT done on earth as it is in heaven? Why is each vital for our Christian lives.
- (9) Focus your prayer time in tonight's small group on God's glory, His kingdom, and His will.
